- 1. The Chairman reported the committee on the recent school's major event bidding of new school site. Despite Choi Hung Estate would not be demolished for reconstruction within the next 15 years, the school authority was preparing to bid a vacant land for re-establishment in Ngau Chi Wan Road behind the St. Joseph Primary School due to the current campus being sub-standard. K.K.Ng said that there were a few schools also interested in bidding the same site and hence the competition would be keen. He would closely liaise with the school over the development of the situation and report to the committee in due course.
- 2. Paul Au reported the committee on the latest financial situation. There were a balance of HK\$53,670 as at 21 December 2006. HK\$9,000 had recently been released for the recruitment of a coach for middle-distance training. A banner being displayed outside the school campus for congratulating our Form 7 student Yu Sze Siu in breaking the Hong Kong Javelin Record had been donated by our Association, a cheque of \$400 would be contributed for such a banner. Paul confirmed that the school was committed to provide official receipts for any OBA donation made and the financial report will be updated on the OBA website ASAP.
- 3. K.K. Ng briefly reported on the running of the three sessions of tutorial classes (2/12, 9/12, 16/12). There were three classes comprising one for F.4, one for F.5 and one F.6 from starting. There were unsteady attendance afterwards and classes were combined to be conducted at times. He and seven old boys including, Francis Lee, Kirk Wong, Gary Leung, Wong Kwok Kei, Chow Sze Chun, Lee Man Tuen and Chan Shi lam were volunteered to be tutors. It was revealed that not many students were attentive at class or enthusiastic to ask questions. As envisaged, many would only like to ask science subject questions. After the last class scheduled on 23/12/06, evaluation would be conducted for further consideration of way forward.
- 4. The Chairman relayed that Philip Chan had agreed to coordinate those old boys in Canada and seek their support of the Association by joining. Paul Au reported that he had a classmate in Toronto would also like to act as a bridge and establish contacts with overseas old boys of his year's. Paul would pass
